Thank you for sharing your children with us!



There's a lot to know about preschool, and a lot to remember at the beginning of the school year! Whether you're new to St. Peter's, or have just forgotten some things over the summer, please, never hesitate to ask questions! We who "live" at the Preschool may forget to mention things because they're so familiar to us — but we do understand that everybody else has a life down the hill. Veteran parents, Teachers, and myself would love to help answer any questions you might have!



Thank you to the many of you who are all caught up on the tons of paper we sent you over the summer! It is so helpful to know so much about your children before school even begins. You will have received a few more papers at Parent's Night that need to be returned as well.

If you haven't yet completed everything, here's what we'll be looking for from you:

- Emergency Contact Form (pink)
- Child Health Assessment (green)
- Photography Waiver, if you wish
- Tuition Agreement, telling us what tuition payment schedule you'd like
- Child Information (blue) We really need to have this form in-hand as the school year begins – it's got so much information that helps us help your child start school!
- Permission To Administer Antihistamine only if you do give us permission, according to the guidelines on the form
- ...and a few other "optionals."

In the next couple of weeks, if I haven't received all of the above (except the Photo Waiver and Antihistamine forms, which are optional), I'll be putting a little reminder into your mailboxes.



Tips for getting out the door...

Encouraging preschoolers to be independent is a lot of what we do here – but preschool independence is a hard-won goal! It is important that children arrive to preschool on time as it sets them up for positive behaviors as they get older and they don't feel like they have missed anything at school.

A little advice from those who've been there:

- Give your child appropriate choices: the choice of one of two or three outfits to wear, the choice of one of two breakfast foods – and give those choices the night before!
- If you're not a bedtime-routine family, consider it; while you may suffer a little in the immediate term, the result is usually more peaceful nights and more perky mornings. Even just a brief "ritual" can give a child the heads-up that bedtime is here, and children at this age crave the knowledge of what comes next.
- Consistency is key! Follow through even if it takes time, energy, and your mental pain
